PASTOR'S MESSAGE | Public Sunday Holy Mass resumes June 21.

At this point, we have enough volunteers to serve as ushers and cleaning crew members to resume Holy Mass with the faithful present (popularly known as "public Holy Mass"). But the schedule is modified at this stage.

Public Sunday Holy Mass will resume on Sunday, June 21 at 7:30 AM and 11 AM at this stage. The 11 AM Holy Mass will be livestreamed.

Why not Saturday at 4 PM & our full Sunday schedule (7:30 AM, 10:30 AM, & Noon)?

- The schedule was created due to volunteer availability.
- 11 AM was chosen to combine the 10:30 AM & Noon at this stage.
- When we have enough volunteers available for Saturday at 4 PM, we will resume it.
- The same regarding the full Sunday schedule.

Why are you waiting until June 21?

- I had announced the possibility of June 7 or 14, but we did not have enough volunteers to proceed.
- We need time to inform parishioners via mailing, the website, Flocknote, Instagram, and Facebook. Obviously, the mailing to registered parishioners will take several days to arrive at their residences. A copy of the mailing will be posted on the website.
- We need time to educate everyone about expectations (e.g., take your temperature at home, wear a mask is a requirement, no physical contact, etc.).
- We need time to finalize a sign-up protocol that will be fair to internet users and non-internet users. Only 50 spots will be available per Holy Mass due to the Archdiocese of Baltimore directive that only 1/3 capacity can be filled.
- We need time to train ushers, who will be doing things differently in directing people to their seats, the Communion procession, and the dismissal.
- We need time to train our cleaning crew members.
- We need time to communicate with our liturgical ministers and to train them. At this stage, only lectors will be assigned. Communion Ministers will begin to serve in mid-August. The Archdiocese strongly recommends not having Altar Servers at this time.

What is the musical format for the Sunday Holy Mass?

- 7:30 AM will remain spoken.
- 11 AM will have music but no congregational singing per Archdiocesan directive and the guidance of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. It will be mostly instrumentation with a few selections offered by the Cantor. The *Gloria*, Responsorial Psalm, Gospel Acclamation, the Eucharistic Acclamations, etc. will be spoken.

What about weekday Holy Mass (Monday - Saturday at 8:30 AM)?

- I want to resume weekday Holy Mass with the faithful present on June 22, but I need volunteers for the cleaning crew. If you can help, contact [Deacon Evan Ponton \(evan.ponton@archbalt.org\)](mailto:evan.ponton@archbalt.org).

What are the next steps?

- Mailing to registered parishioners
- Introducing the sign-up reservation system
- Education about what to expect
- Training of volunteers and liturgical ministers

PUBLIC SUNDAY HOLY MASS RESUMES JUNE 21

We need parishioners to volunteer to serve as usher and cleaning crew members to begin public Holy Mass on the weekdays (Monday – Saturday at 8:30 AM) and for additional Sunday Holy Masses (Saturday at 4 PM and the full Sunday schedule).

Ushers guide people to enter, find seating, during the Communion Procession, and to depart. Offertory will be received in containers on a table after Holy Mass. You won't touch anyone or anything except opening the doors for Holy Mass. Can you help? Contact Father Harris (rharris@archbalt.org).

Cleaning Crew members will clean the church after Holy Mass. You would use sanitizing wipes on pews where people sat, sanctuary railing, sanctuary chairs, the top of the Ambo (pulpit), doorknobs, and the restrooms (sink, toilet, doorknob). We will provide the gloves and sanitizing wipes. You supply the mask. We do not envision it taking longer than 30 minutes. can you help? Contact Deacon Evan Ponton (evan.ponton@archbalt.org).

REFLECTION ON THE SUNDAY GOSPEL READING

Read John 3:16-18. “God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life” (John 3:16). This familiar Bible verse reminds us that love is the motivation for God to create us. When we allowed sin and death to wound humanity by the abuse of our free choice, God did not abandon us. The motivation for God to save us and to heal us is His love for us. Take the time to thank God, who so loves you!

Catechism of the Catholic Church #249: “From the beginning, the revealed truth of the Holy Trinity has been at the very root of the Church's living faith, principally by means of Baptism. It finds its expression in the rule of baptismal faith, formulated in the preaching, catechesis and prayer of the Church. Such formulations are already found in the apostolic writings, such as this salutation taken up in the Eucharistic liturgy: ‘The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.’”

WHAT HAPPENED TO THE TREES ON CAMPUS?

A report from Dennis Kast, Business and Facilities Manager: The trees along the entrance driveway have been cutdown due to the Emerald Ash Borer. This insect infects the tree that causes it to die. The trees on the driveway ranged from 90% dead to 50% dead. An Arborist was consulted, and his recommendation was to remove the trees. There was a safety consideration for their removal. Ash trees become very brittle when dead. A falling tree could cause great harm to a passerby. The next step is to grind the stumps, remove the grindings, cover the holes with topsoil, and reseed.
