PASTOR'S MESSAGE | A Blessed Father's Day

MANAGING OUR EXPECTATIONS AS WE RESUME PUBLIC WORSHIP ON SUNDAYS

I am looking forward to the resumption of public Sunday Holy Mass at 7:30 am and 11:00 am. I joyfully welcome you home. I trust that it will be a joyful and moving experience of those who can attend.

Per Archdiocesan directive, only 30% of the building may be occupied. Since seating is limited, you must reserve your seat. Reservations for June 28 will be taken from Monday, June 22 at 9:00 am until Thursday, June 25 at 5:00 pm (note new closing time. See details on our website

I trust that those who will attend this Sunday will strictly follow the protocols for the safety of all. This is part of engaging in worship with joy. See the instructions on our website (<https://www.holyfamilyrandallstown.org/reopening>).

I encourage you to manage your expectations. It is my hope that COVID-19 cases will continue to decline. However, cases are rising in states that reopened earlier than Maryland.

Remember that Archbishop Lori has continued to suspend the Sunday Holy Mass obligation. I reiterate what I said this past Sunday. [T]here is reluctance to join a public gathering at this time, especially indoors. I want you to know that is fine. No one should allow their conscience to be troubled about this matter." Sunday Holy Mass at 7:30 am and 11:00 am will be on Facebook Live. Note the new times.

I ask you to remain prudent and vigilant. This is not against having faith in God. God has given us common sense.

CHANGE IN SEMINARIAN SAM HUFFER'S SUMMER ASSIGNMENT

As the state of Maryland undergoes the phases of reopening, people will be making different decisions based on various factors, including any pre-existing conditions. You know that I suffered an autoimmune blood platelet disorder several years ago that required multiple hospitalizations. Thanks be to God that I have been in remission for several years now. However, it remains a pre-existing condition and I govern myself accordingly during this pandemic.

So that seminarian Sam Huffer can have freedom to visit his family and other things, he has been reassigned to the pastorate of Saint Agnes, Catonsville and Saint William of York, Baltimore. While it would have been ideal for Sam to be assigned to live elsewhere and continue to serve at Holy Family, it was not possible. I am grateful for Sam's enthusiastic participation in our parish in these short two weeks. I deeply regret that due to my pre-existing condition, it had to change.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PUBLIC SUNDAY HOLY MASS

Beginning Sunday, June 21, public Sunday Holy Mass will be celebrated at 7:30 am and 11:00 am only. When more parishioners volunteer to serve as ushers and cleaning crew members, I hope to restore the full Sunday and weekday schedule.

1. RESERVING YOUR SEAT IS A MUST

Per Archdiocesan directive, only 30% of the church can be occupied per Holy Mass. With social distancing, & including the ministers of the liturgy (which I have limited), **there are about 35 seats available per Holy Mass.**

You must reserve your seat. Reservations for June 28 are open from Monday, June 22 at 9:00 am until Thursday, June 25 at 5:00 pm. There are two ways to sign-up.

1. **Sign-up in person by coming to the Parish Office** between 9:00 am – 5:00 pm. You will receive proof of reservation to present to an usher.
2. **Sign-up via our website (www.holyfamilyrandallstown.org/signup).** Follow the instructions, sign-up, and print the email confirmation as your proof of reservation to present to an usher. While the link will be on the website on Sunday, June 14, you will not be able to sign-up until the reservation system is open.

2. INSTRUCTIONS WHEN COMING TO SUNDAY HOLY MASS

1. **THE SUNDAY OBLIGATION CONTINUES TO BE SUSPENDED.** Do not allow your conscience to be burdened. If you are concerned about your health or you are not ready to join any public gatherings yet, please be comfortable about not attending. Sunday Holy Mass at 11:00 am will be livestreamed on Facebook Live. You do not need a Facebook account to access it (www.facebook.com/HFCRandallstown/live).
2. **CHECK YOUR HEALTH CONDITION.** You must take your temperature at home before you leave. If you have a fever, or are sick, or suspect that you may have been (or was exposed to) a contagious illness, please stay home and take care of yourself. If you are awaiting test results for COVID-19 or any contagious illness, you may not come to the parish campus, whether you have symptoms or not.
3. **MASKS MUST BE WORN BEFORE ENTERING THE CHURCH.** All persons aged 2 and older must always wear a mask. This is the requirement of the Archdiocese of Baltimore and the State of Maryland.
4. **CHILDREN MUST OBSERVE SOCIAL DISTANCE NORMS TOO.** If you bring children, they must be able to stay in one place. Otherwise, for the sake of their health and the health of others, they should not come to Holy Mass. For social distance reasons, the multipurpose room is not available.
5. **GREETING OTHERS:** While we will be happy to see others, greet them with words and a wave. Please do not congregate, hug, kiss, shake hands, etc.
6. **SEATING PROTOCOL:** You must provide proof of reservation. The ushers will seat you—whether as an individual or as a household—in designated seating from the front to the back.
7. **THE OFFERTORY COLLECTION WILL BE RECEIVED AFTER HOLY MASS.** Any offerings are placed in the designated receptacle as you are leaving the church.
8. **COMMUNION PROCESSION:** Follow the priest's instruction. No one may remain in the pew. Please maintain the social distancing of 6-feet from another person. Those who are not receiving Holy Communion will receive a blessing. For the safety of all, Holy Communion will be distributed initially in the hand only.
9. **DISMISSAL PROTOCOL:** You must follow the direction of the ushers, who will dismiss members of the congregation a pew at a time to ensure social distancing.

3. LOOKING FORWARD TO WORSHIPPING WITH YOU

I am looking forward to worshipping with you, whether in person or virtually via our livestream. Let us continue to pray for one another.

LET US CONTINUE TO PRAY FOR ONE ANOTHER

Let us pray for one another. Please continue to reach out to each other to see how others are doing. Know that the staff and I are here to serve you.

PUBLIC SUNDAY HOLY MASS RESUMES JUNE 21

We need parishioners to volunteer to serve as usher and cleaning crew members to begin public Holy Mass on the weekdays (Monday – Saturday at 8:30 am) and for additional Sunday Holy Masses (Saturday at 4:00 pm and the full Sunday schedule).

Ushers guide people to enter, find seating, during the Communion Procession, and to depart. Offertory will be received in containers on a table after Holy Mass. You won't touch anyone or anything except opening the doors for Holy Mass. Can you help? Contact Father Harris (rharris@archbalt.org).

Cleaning Crew members will clean the church after Holy Mass. You would use sanitizing wipes on pews where people sat, sanctuary railing, sanctuary chairs, the top of the Ambo (pulpit), doorknobs, and the restrooms (sink, toilet, doorknob). We will provide the gloves and sanitizing wipes. You supply the mask. We do not envision it taking longer than 30 minutes. can you help? Contact Deacon Evan Ponton (evan.ponton@archbalt.org).

NOTIFYING THE PARISH ABOUT CORONAVIRUS TESTING

If you have visited our parish campus, and later learn that you may have been exposed to someone with the COVID-19 virus, please contact the Parish Office so that we can pray for you. REFLECTION ON THE SUNDAY GOSPEL READING

Read *Matthew 10:26-33*. “[Jesus said to His disciples,] ‘Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father’” (Matthew 10:32-33). The Lord Jesus Christ is giving instructions for those who will be sent forth to give witness to His Gospel. We must not give in to any fears that may come from those who may ridicule or reject us because of our faith. With confidence in God’s unwavering love for us, we persevere in professing and practicing our faith. Even if we face persecution, the message of the Gospel will continue to transform lives for good and will have the last word. Pray for the grace to believe that. Pray for those who are being persecuted because of their Christian faith, especially those who are the subject of violent persecution.

Catechism of the Catholic Church #1816: “The disciple of Christ must not only keep the faith and live on it, but also profess it, confidently bear witness to it, and spread it: ‘All however must be prepared to confess Christ before men and to follow him along the way of the Cross, amidst the persecutions which the Church never lacks.’ Service of and witness to the faith are necessary for salvation: ‘So every one who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven; but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven.’”

NEWS – UPDATES

WHAT HAPPENED TO THE TREES ON CAMPUS?

A report from Dennis Kast, Business and Facilities Manager: The trees along the entrance driveway have been cutdown due to the Emerald Ash Borer. This insect infects the tree that causes it to die. The trees on the driveway ranged from 90% dead to 50% dead. An Arborist was consulted, and his recommendation was to remove the trees. There was a safety consideration for their removal. Ash trees become very brittle when dead. A falling tree could cause great harm to a passerby. The next step is to grind the stumps, remove the grindings, cover the holes with topsoil, and reseed.
