RESPECT LIFE MONTH 2023 • PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The Catholic Church in the USA celebrates Respect Life Month in October. This year's theme is, "Radical Solidarity." Note well that this has always been a part of our efforts. Bishop Michael F. Burbidge – Bishop of Arlington and the Chairman of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life ctivities – writes in his Respect Life Month 2023 Statement:

Being in radical solidarity with women who are pregnant or raising children in difficult circumstances means putting our love for them into action and putting their needs before our own. Pope Francis reminds us that solidarity "refers to something more than a few sporadic acts of generosity. It presumes the creation of a new mindset," a transformation within our own hearts (#188).

Our advocacy in the public square begins with defending the rights of unborn children. For every child to have a chance in life, they need to have a chance to live. However, our advocacy does not end at the beginning stages of life. We address issues about caring for the poor and helping them out of poverty, working for racial justice, promoting education, treating immigrants and refugees with dignity, fostering peace with justice at home and abroad, among other things.

- supporting Project Rachael, which helps women and men to heal in the aftermath of an abortion;
- among other things.

Respect for the gift of human life is good news! From the moment of conception-- and during every stage, condition, and circumstance of life -- we have an inherent dignity. The right to life is the fundamental right upon which other rights can be exercised.
