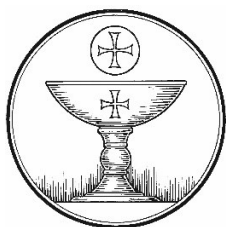

WORSHIP DURING SUNDAY HOLY MASS

On the night before the Lord Jesus died, He commanded us to do this in memory of Him (cf. *Gospel of Luke 22:19*). Therefore, His Church teaches that **we have the obligation to worship during Holy Mass on Sundays and other designated holy days of obligation.** The first followers of Christ did this regularly on Sunday, the day that Jesus rose from the dead (cf. *Acts of the Apostles 20:7*). They were devoted to it (cf. *Acts of the Apostles 2:42*).

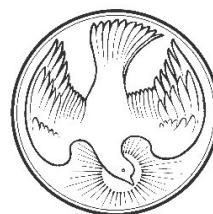
We are “much obliged” to thank Jesus for our many blessings and helping us to deal with any burdens. We can enjoy the fellowship of the community, sing praise to God, learn how God’s Word relates to our lives, and receive Holy Communion if prepared to do so. (Note that this obligation is suspended if we are ill, taking care of a sick loved one, or inclement weather makes it difficult to travel.)

Our **Sunday Holy Mass schedule** begins on Saturday at 4:00 PM (Organ and Cantor) and continues Sunday at 7:30 AM (spoken), 11:00 AM (Organ and Cantor).

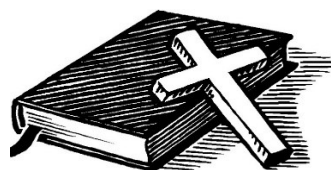
On announced **Holy Days of Obligation**, the schedule is at 8:30 AM (spoken) and 7:00 PM (Organ and Cantor).

Holy Mass on the weekdays is celebrated at 8:30 AM from Monday – Friday.

OFFER PRAYER DAILY



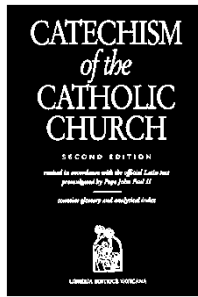
Our relationship with God continues to grow by spending time in conversation with Him. **Prayer gives God permission to enter the situations of our lives. We grow in awareness of God’s loving presence.** In the morning, we ask God for His blessings and guidance for the day ahead. In the evening, we thank God for blessings received and ask for His mercy for any sins we have committed. We pray about those situations experienced and persons we have met during that day.



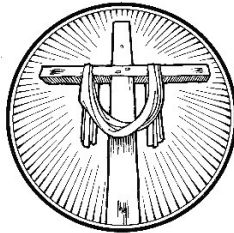
READ THE BIBLE

Reading one of the Gospels in the New Testament is a good start. **Read** a passage slowly and several times. **Reflect** on what is happening in the passage and what God may be saying to you. **Respond** by asking God to help you to live according to the lessons that you have learned during your prayer. The **Sunday Bulletin** provides the readings for Sunday Holy Mass and a reflection on the Gospel reading. STUDY CATHOLIC CHURCH TEACHING



The teachings of the Catholic Church come from the Word of God in the Bible and the living Apostolic Tradition. **Learn what the Church teaches and why the Church teaches it.** In addition to reading the Bible, this is how we form our conscience. *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* can help you. THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Jesus gave us this sacrament on the first Easter (cf. *Gospel of John* 20:19-23). What is confessed to the priest will be held in strict confidence and will not be held against you. Remember, you are coming to experience God's saving mercy.

I benefit from this sacrament as a penitent. As a confessor, I also know how God helps people to overcome their sins and to enjoy the opportunities that we have as children of God. Has it been awhile? Do not be afraid. Ask the priest to help you.

Scheduled confessions are on Saturdays (3:00 PM – 3:45 PM) and the First Sunday of the Month (10:15 AM – 10:45 AM) in the church. You can also schedule to make an appointment with me or any other priest.

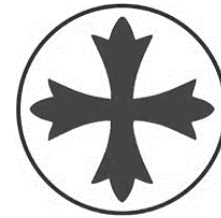

REGISTER IN THE PARISH

My staff and I depend on our records for planning and to communicate with you. We want you to receive important parish news. It is important to be registered if you will need a letter from the Parish Office to serve as a Godparent or a Confirmation sponsor.

Offertory envelopes establish a record of our contributions. The Parish gives a statement at the end of the year for your tax return. It also helps the parish and the Archdiocese to plan by having an accurate account of our households.
